**I. CALL TO ORDER/SELF INTRODUCTIONS AND OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC COMMENT**

The regular meeting of the Pedestrian Advisory Committee (PAC) was called to order at approximately 6:00 p.m. in the Solano Transportation Authority's Conference Room.

**II. APPROVAL OF MAY 17, 2007 PEDESTRIAN ADVISORY COMMITTEE (PAC) AGENDA**

The May 17, 2007 PAC agenda was approved by general consensus of present PAC members.

**III. Approval of the January 18, 2007 PAC meeting minutes**

On a motion by Allan Deal and a second by Lynne Williams, the PAC approved the January 18, 2007 meeting minutes with a correction to Allan Deal's name.

#### **IV. Action Items**

##### **A. Solano Bicycle Pedestrian Program**

Robert Guerrero, STA, explained the reduction in estimated Eastern Solano County Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ) funding and the increase in Transportation Development Act (TDA) Article 3 funds. Mr. Guerrero also explained that Suisun City's Railroad Ave Class II project was postponed and that the funding allocated for it needed to be redistributed. Mr. Guerrero indicated that the BAC reviewed STA staff's recommendation and unanimously approved projects that the PAC would be reviewing at this meeting. Mike Duncan, City of Fairfield, explained the need to bank funding previously recommended by the BAC and the PAC until next year for Fairfield's McGary Road Project and for Benicia's State Park Road Bike/Ped project. On a motion by Larry Mork and a second Frank Morris, the PAC unanimously agreed to forward a recommendation to the STA Board to approve funding for FY 2007-08 for the following projects:

- City of Fairfield West Texas Street Gateway (\$73,000)
- Solano County Suisun Valley Bridge (\$110,000)
- Solano County Vacaville Dixon Bikeway (\$343,000)
- City of Vacaville Nob Hill Bike Path (\$300,000)
- City of Vacaville Ulatis Creek Bike Path (\$127,098)

In the same motion the PAC unanimously agreed to bank the following funds until FY 08-09:

- City of Benicia State Park Road Bike/Ped Project (\$569,000)
- City of Fairfield McGary Road (\$175,000)

#### **V. Information Items**

##### **A. Pedestrian Priority Projects**

Robert Guerrero, STA, provided a background on the Pedestrian Priority Projects process and the difficulties the PAC had to provide a recommendation of projects. Mr. Guerrero gave the PAC three options to assist the PAC in developing pedestrian priority projects. The PAC chose to have a subcommittee meet and discuss potential projects. The PAC decided that the subcommittee would also provide a recommendation of projects for the PAC to consider approving at their July 19, 2007 meeting. Eva Laevastu, Lynne Williams, and Larry Mork volunteered to participate on the subcommittee. Robert Guerrero agreed to schedule a meeting for the subcommittee in the next couple of weeks.

##### **B. MTC Routine Accommodations Status**

Robert Guerrero, STA, provided a status report on MTC's Routine Accommodations effort. Mr. Guerrero discussed the STA's role in implementing Routine Accommodations and how PAC members could utilize MTC's database. Eva Laevastu mentioned that the PAC should consider discussing projects on MTC's Routine Accommodations database that have a significant impact to pedestrian facilities at future PAC meetings.

##### **C. North Connector Transportation for Livable Communities Corridor Concept Plan**

Robert Guerrero, STA, discussed the STA's North Connector TLC Corridor Concept Plan's Public Workshop held May 10<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Guerrero provided a tentative timeline for the project's completion. Mr. Guerrero also indicated that a draft plan will be available in July 2007 and will be discussed at the next BAC and PAC meetings. Dee Swanhuysen, Bay Area Ridge Trail, questioned how the plan will address connections to the Ridge Trail network. Mr. Guerrero responded that plan will acknowledge the network and connections, but that further evaluation to these connections will have to be addressed in a separate study.

**D. Bay Area Ridge Trail Tour**

Eva Laevastu, PAC Chair, discussed a tour provided by the Bay Area Ridge Trail Council. The tour was attended by representatives from Congressman George Miller's office, Bay Area Coastal Conservancy, Bay Area Ridge Trail Council, Solano County Parks and Recreation, Solano County Department of Resource Management, Napa County Parks and Recreation, and the Solano Transportation Authority. Ms. Laevastu indicated that the tour included locations such as the Benicia/Martinez Bridge, Carquinez/Al Zampa Bridge, Lynch Canyon, and Jameson Canyon/Highway 12. The PAC discussed the possibility of attending a similar tour in Jameson Canyon/Highway 12 when the committee discusses the scope of a potential alternative modes connection in Jameson Canyon/Highway 12.

**VI. Committee Member Comments**

The PAC members discussed the following items for discussion at the July 17<sup>th</sup> meeting:

- Solano Countywide Pedestrian Priority Projects
- Solano Bicycle Pedestrian Program (SBPP) FY 2008-09 timeline for implementation
- North Connector TLC Plan

The PAC also discussed their desire to have regularly scheduled meetings in an effort to meet more consistently. They agreed that if a meeting was not necessary it can be cancelled.

- I. CALL TO ORDER—SELF INTRODUCTIONS AND OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC COMMENT  
Participants exchanged introductions. The Chair determined that a quorum was not present, and no action could be taken. Paul Weise reported that the Fulton/Home Acres project in Vallejo has been completed.
- II. APPROVAL OF JULY 19, 2007 AGENDA  
In absence of a quorum, no action was taken on the July 19, 2007 PAC agenda.
- III. APPROVAL OF MAY 17, 2007 PAC MINUTES  
In absence of a quorum, no action was taken on the May 17, 2007 PAC Minutes.

#### IV. INFORMATION ITEMS

##### A. Bay Trail/Ridge Trail Vallejo Alignment Feasibility Study

Maureen Gaffney, San Francisco Bay Trail, gave a brief overview of the San Francisco (SF) Bay Trail Project. The SF Bay Trail Project seeks to connect the nine Bay Area Counties via an estimated 500-mile bicycle and pedestrian friendly trail. Ms. Gaffney reported that \$6 Million in grants from Prop 84 is available for trail projects from the coastal conservancy and expressed interest in working with as many agencies as possible. Applications for the funding will be available in the next few months.

Eva Laevastu, PAC Chair, mentioned that the Bay Trail and Ridge Trail projects are a great opportunity to support ecotourism and efforts to complete both trails play an important role in helping the county. Ms. Laevastu reminded the committees to not only focus on individual Bay Trail and Ridge Trail projects, but to look at community connectivity as well.

Linda Williams, PAC Member, asked if the new eastern span of the Bay Bridge is bicycle and pedestrian friendly. Maureen Gaffney, SF Bay Trail, replied that there are bike lanes going in both directions, but only on the eastern span.

##### B. SR 12/Jameson Canyon Corridor Mobility Improvement Account (CMIA)

Robert Macaulay, STA, reported that the project was approved for \$111 Million and is currently fully funded. The construction is expected to begin in 2010 and includes 8' shoulders and class 2 bike lanes.

Lynne Williams, PAC Member, asked where the construction segments began and ended. Mr. Macaulay replied that he will clarify this.

##### C. MTC Routine Accommodations

In Robert Guerrero's absence, Robert Macaulay, STA, briefly introduced the item and referred any questions in further detail regarding the Routine Accommodations effort keep to Mr. Guerrero.

##### D. North Connector Transportation for Livable Communities (TLC) Concept Plan

After giving an overview of the concept plan Robert Macaulay, STA, handed out copies of the draft concept plan and invited the PAC to review and document over the next few weeks and provide comments before September. Eva Laevastu, PAC Chair, suggested that an e-mail notice to the attendees of previous North Connector meetings be sent out to reach a larger group of participants to review and provide comments on the draft.

## V. ACTION ITEMS

### A. Solano Bicycle Pedestrian Program (SBPP)

Robert Macaulay described the recommendation to the STA Board to issue a Call for SBPP Projects for the FY 2008-09 to FY 2010-11 SBPP three-year Plan. However, a quorum was not present, hence, no action could be taken.

There was some confusion regarding the terms of the three-year plan amongst committee members. Robert Macaulay, STA, provided the committee with a handout of graphical representation of the update and implementation strategy to show options for how the three-year plan could be updated.

After Mr. Macaulay clarified that the handout was intended to address the need for an implementation strategy for the three-year plan. Sara Woo, STA, gave a brief presentation regarding the proposed three-year plan, which includes FY 2008-09, FY 2009-10, and FY 2010-11. The proposed three-year plan would include the priority projects already approved and programmed for FY 2008-09.

Ed Huestis, City of Vacaville, mentioned that there had been a subcommittee that consisted of BAC, PAC, and Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) members appointed to discuss the terms of the three-year plan. The subcommittee met in March of 2007 and agreed that each cycle would be planned as a three-year cycle independent of subsequent cycles. Mr. Huestis also provided that the current cycle is a special case of incorporating a “rolling” element to the previous three year plan, attaching two additional years, which will only be in place through FY 2010-11. This special cycle is meant to include agencies eligible to apply that did not get the opportunity to do so during the first call for projects. Thereafter, the terms of the SBPP three-year plan implementation would revert back to planning for independent three-year cycles.

When a call for projects is issued, the consensus among the committee members was to support STA staff’s proposed three-year plan format.

### B. Solano Countywide Pedestrian Plan Update: Pedestrian Priority Projects List

Sara Woo, STA, introduced the item. Larry Mork lead a discussion about the meeting results of the July 10<sup>th</sup>, 2007 PAC subcommittee meeting. Mr. Mork introduced the seven priority projects and explained how the subcommittee came up with the list.

The consensus among the committee members present was favorable to the seven priority projects. The PAC agreed to postpone the action until September since a quorum was not present. In the event that taking an action becomes critical, there was consensus to have a special meeting to take action to forward the recommendation to the STA board.

VI. COMMENTS FROM COMMITTEE MEMBERS

The committee recommended that STA staff check for any duplication in the priority projects list.

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VII. ADJOURNMENT

The PAC meeting was adjourned at approximately 7:40 p.m. The next meeting is scheduled for Thursday, September 20<sup>th</sup>, 2007 at 6:00 p.m.

A. SR 12/Jameson Canyon Corridor Mobility Improvement Account (CMIA) Project Update – (Robert Macaulay, STA)

The Purpose and Need for the Caltrans SR 12 Jameson Canyon Project on SR 12 is to relieve traffic congestion, improve mobility, enhance safety and improve current roadway conditions. The project includes widening SR 12 from I-80 in Solano County to and including SR 12/29 intersection in Napa County. The existing SR 12 has one lane in each direction with no median barrier. It has sections that do not meet current highway standards and consistently maintains a poor level of service in many sections. This Project will widen approximately 6 miles of SR 12 from two to four lanes and upgrade the highway to current standards from Interstate 80 in Solano County to State Route 29 (SR 29) in Napa County.

Caltrans has prepared an environmental document for the SR 12 Jameson Canyon Project. This environmental document is an Initial Study with Proposed Mitigated Negative Declaration /Environmental Assessment. The environmental document combines the Project and the SR 12/29 Interchange Improvement into a single study area for a comprehensive environmental evaluation and approval. Caltrans currently has the environmental document available for public comment and is hosting a public meeting on the evening of September 13<sup>th</sup> at Nelda Mundy Elementary School.

B. MTC's Routine Accommodations – (Sara Woo, STA)

The Metropolitan Transportation Commission will provide a website link listing transportation projects throughout the Bay Area as part of their Routine Accommodations Policy. The purpose of this link is to provide an opportunity for the general public, and bicycle and pedestrian advocates to review the transportation projects for bicycle and pedestrian consideration. MTC expects to have a list ready for review in the next month. In the meantime, the Solano Transportation Authority is currently working with a Solano Project Development Working Group (PDWG) which consists of participants that handle day to day transportation project administration at the city and county staff. One of the tasks the committee will be discussing is MTC's Routine Accommodations Policy.

C. North Connector Transportation for Livable Communities (TLC) Corridor Concept Plan – (Robert Guerrero, STA)

The purpose of the North Connector Transportation for Livable Communities (TLC) Corridor Concept Plan is to provide a document with bicycle, pedestrian and transit related improvements in the North Connector project area. The proposed

improvements will support the current and future land uses. The STA Board formally released the draft of the document for public comments. Comments on the plan will be accepted until Friday, October 12, 2007. Upon completion of the public comment period, a final version of the Plan will be prepared for approval consideration by the STA Board at their December 12, 2007 Board meeting.

- D. Solano Bicycle Pedestrian Program (SBPP) Update – (Sara Woo, STA)  
In September 2006, the BAC and PAC adopted a 3-year Solano Bicycle Pedestrian Program (SBPP) to help them recommend funding to the STA Board each fiscal year. As stated in the SBPP program guidelines, each January, before the next fiscal year of recommended projects, the BAC and PAC will receive presentations from project sponsors about the deliverability of their projects and ask for a formal funding recommendation from the BAC and PAC to the STA Board to program their funds.

Due to the impending shortfall of obligation authority of federal funds in fiscal year 2008-09, funding available for FY 2008-09 projects is in jeopardy. As an administrative action, STA Staff is recommending that the STA Board adopt the 3-year SBPP Funding Plan in October, allowing STA Staff to program funding into State and Regional funding plans to help protect these funds.

Despite this “approved” programming, BAC and PAC members will still have their chance to review these projects in January 2008, before FY 2008-09 that these funds are programmed in, and recommend funding changes if warranted. STA Staff can then amend these State and Regional funding plans accordingly (assuming that the STA Board adopts the BAC and PAC recommended changes).

- E. PAC Meeting Schedule and Work Plan for 2008 – (Sara Woo, STA)  
In preparation for the upcoming year, STA Staff has prepared a tentative meeting schedule for 2008. Starting in January 2008, the PAC shall meet every third Thursday of every odd month (See Attachment IV.E). The PAC will be encouraged to provide input on a 2008 PAC Work Plan. STA staff will reflect the PAC’s comments in a draft Work Plan for the PAC to consider approving at their November 15, 2007 meeting.
- F. PAC Membership 2008 – (Sara Woo, STA)  
Attached is the current PAC membership roster (See Attachment IV.F). STA staff would like to welcome the PAC’s newest member, Brian Travis from the Tri-City and County Cooperative Planning Group. The PAC has a few remaining vacant positions currently available and has one member whose term is expiring this year. STA staff is available to assist in re-appointments to the committee and will continue seeking members to fill the vacant positions. PAC members are encouraged to assist STA staff in obtaining new members.

**Background:**

The Solano Countywide Pedestrian Plan was developed through the efforts and guidance of the Solano Transportation Authority (STA), Landpeople (consultants for the Countywide Pedestrian Plan), and the Solano Pedestrian Advisory Committee (PAC). The Countywide Pedestrian Plan was recommended and approved by the PAC in September 2004 followed by STA Board adoption in October 2004. The plan is the first effort in the Bay Area to identify pedestrian projects on a countywide basis. The STA was given an award by the Northern California Chapter of the American Planning Association (APA) for the development and implementation of this Pedestrian Plan.

Staff from Solano County and the seven cities initially identified the pedestrian priority projects included in the current Solano Countywide Pedestrian Plan. With an increased portion of funding released for pedestrian facilities in Solano County, the PAC requested to revisit and reprioritize the current list of pedestrian projects. Per that request, the STA Board issued a call for any new or revised pedestrian projects on October 11, 2006. Initially, the updated list of pedestrian priority projects was tentatively scheduled to be included as an action item for recommendation to the STA Board at the November 16, 2006 PAC meeting. However, the revision of the pedestrian priority projects list has since experienced delays (See Attachment A for a summary of PAC activities).

**Discussion:**

On July 10, 2007, Larry Mork, Eva Laevastu, and Pat Moran participated on the PAC sub-committee to review the project application scores. The PAC sub-committee agreed upon a top priority projects list that includes seven (7) projects. STA staff clarified applications regarding multi-jurisdictional projects and recommended the group consider including the North Connector TLC Corridor in the priority projects list. After an extensive discussion, the group recommended the following seven (7) pedestrian projects as the top priority projects for the Solano Countywide Pedestrian Plan Update (in order):

1. Rio Vista Waterfront Plan and Improvement;
2. Benicia State Park Road Bike and Pedestrian Bridge;
3. Solano County Old Town Cordelia Improvement;
4. North Connector TLC Corridor (multi-jurisdictional);
5. Dixon West "B" Street Pedestrian Grade Separation;
6. Vallejo Ferry Station Pedestrian and Streetscape; and
7. Fairfield West Texas Street Gateway

The remaining project submittals were recommended by the group to be included in the Countywide Pedestrian Plan updated list of countywide significant pedestrian projects (See Attachment B).

On July 19, 2007, the PAC was scheduled to meet and discuss the recommendations made by the sub-committee members. At this meeting, the goal was for the PAC to provide a recommendation to the STA Board. However, a quorum of committee members was not present, thus no action could be taken. In absence of a quorum, the consensus among committee members who were present was to postpone the action until their next meeting on September 20, 2007 at 6:00 p.m. Interested TAC Members are encouraged to attend this meeting.

**Recommendation:**

*Forward a recommendation to the STA Board to approve an update to the Solano Countywide Pedestrian Plan to include the revised Pedestrian Priority Projects List.*
