Vacaville Schools Celebrate International Walk to School Day

SUISUN CITY, CA –Six schools in Vacaville will participate in International Walk to School Day on Wednesday, October 9th, 2013. Students, families and teachers from Orchard, Browns Valley, Cambridge, Markham, Hemlock, and Ace Elementary Schools will be joining with Vacaville Mayor Steve Hardy to celebrate walking and biking to school.

International Walk to School Day is an internationally recognized day to celebrate the benefits of active transportation by encouraging school children to walk and bicycle to school. Cities and local health departments join in the celebration by urging schools across the world to take part in Walk or Roll to School Day. “When students walk or bicycle to school, they increase their physical activity, which is great for their health. By participating in the SR2S program, they also learn valuable pedestrian and bicycle safety skills, and how reducing traffic helps the environment, their school and community” said Mayor Steve Hardy.

Walk to School activities provide opportunities for communities to address safety concerns around schools. Reducing the risk of injury includes teaching children age-appropriate walking and bicycling skills, reminding drivers to be extra vigilant in watching for young walkers and bicyclists, and identifying and eliminating hazardous conditions along routes to school that need to be fixed. Walk to School activities can also help children reach the minimum of 60 minutes of physical activity on most days of the week as recommended by the U.S. Surgeon General.

The six Vacaville schools will join schools across Solano County in commemorating International Walk to School Day. “When students walk to and from school in groups with adult supervision, they have fun, build a sense of community, increase their physical activity, and arrive at school ready to learn. The Walking School Bus program is great because it also decreases traffic congestion around schools, lowering asthma triggers, and improving air quality.” said Robin Cox, Solano County Public Health, Community Wellness Bureau Manager”.

Solano Safe Routes to School (SR2S) is a program of the Solano Transportation Authority (STA) in partnership with Solano County Public Health Department, Yolo-Solano Air Quality Management District, Bay Area Air Quality Management District and the Metropolitan Transportation Commission to encourage children to walk or bike to school for the benefit of health, safety and the environment.
