

# Study Purpose

1. Identify a safe and functional bicycle and pedestrian connection between American Canyon and north Vallejo neighborhoods and the Vallejo Waterfront/Ferry
2. Determine preferred **Bay Trail** and **Vine Trail** routes (may be combined or separate)



# An Important Regional Connection

The area under study is:

A gap in Vallejo and Solano County bicycle and pedestrian transportation system

A gap between parts of Vallejo divided by highway and freeway

A gap in the **S.F. Bay Trail** planned to extend around the entire San Francisco Bay

A gap in the **Napa Valley Vine Trail** planned to extend from Calistoga to the Vallejo Ferry Terminal

## The Bay Trail Improves Quality of Life Through:


- **Recreation** – Exercise along the shoreline, relaxation and increased social network
- **Education** – Wildlife viewing and Bay Area history
- **Transportation** – Access to schools, shopping, work and transit

**When complete, the 500-mile Bay Trail will form a continuous corridor around San Francisco Bay, passing through 47 cities, 9 counties and crossing 7 toll bridges.**

















# 9: Broadway/Lewis Brown Drive Intersection












### Connecting Vallejo: The Bay Trail - Vine Trail Study

STA is conducting a study on behalf of the City of Vallejo to determine the preferred trail routes between existing trails in American Canyon and existing trails along White Slough and on the Vallejo waterfront.

The **San Francisco Bay Trail**, when complete, will consist of a 500-mile continuous corridor around the San Francisco Bay passing through almost 50 cities and nine counties. The **Napa Valley Vine Trail**, when finished, will begin at the Ferry Terminal and continue north for 47 miles, through world-renowned vineyards and towns of Napa Valley, to its northern gateway in Calistoga.

Segments of both trails are open and popular, with active use by pedestrians and cyclists. Some trail "gaps" are under study to determine the preferred alignments to complete the trail through Vallejo. The focus of this current study is on trail routing - which may be different for the Bay Trail and the Vine Trail - through two areas of Vallejo shown on map below. The map illustrates existing and potential routes. The study will consider environmental and engineering feasibility, cost, public support and other factors to determine the appropriate alignment(s). **How you can get involved:**

- Monday May 12, 6 to 8 PM:** Attend the initial public workshop at the **City of Vallejo Conference Center on Mare Island - 375 G Street** (on the left just after the bridge) to learn more about the Bay Trail, Vine Trail and study area, and to provide information and ideas.
- Saturday, June 28, 10 AM to 4 PM:** Participate in a walking and cycling field review of the alternative routes, with a tour of the northern options starting at 10 AM and the southern alternatives at 1 PM.
- Wednesday, August 6, 6 to 8 PM:** Attend a public meeting at a site yet to be determined to review the preliminary study recommendations and to offer your thoughts.
