## **SolanoExpress Transit Corridor Study Public Workshops**

**SUISUN CITY, CA** – The Solano Transportation Authority, in partnership with Fairfield and Suisun Transit (FAST) and Solano County Transit (SolTrans) is holding a series of public workshops to gather input on proposed route changes to the SolanoExpress regional transit system.

Currently the seven SolanoExpress routes provide regional connections between the cities in Solano County and neighboring counties, serving many locations throughout the region including Davis, Sacramento, and San Francisco; BART stations at El Cerrito del Norte, Pleasant Hill and Walnut Creek; Solano College; Suisun City Amtrak station; and San Francisco Bay Ferry terminal in Vallejo.

A study of the I-80/I-680/I-780/State Route 12 Transit Corridor was completed last year. One of the key findings was that the overall bus system should be able to increase ridership, and provide more frequent and improved service. The recommended service alternative outlines a regional express bus system providing services equal to the speed, comfort, safety, reliability and frequency offered by BART rail operations, at costs that are affordable to the residents of Solano. The proposed system offers:

- Simple and easy to understand routes
- Better service frequencies on each new route
- Faster service than the current system, and with capital improvements, becomes even faster.
- Efficient routings with fewer diversions and more direct routes
- Consolidated markets (each bus serves more than one market) leading to increased ridership
