**May 12th, 2016 is 22nd Annual Bike to Work Day;
Nominations Sought for Solano Bike Commuter of the Year**

SUISUN CITY, CA - May 12th marks the San Francisco Bay Area's **22nd Annual Bike to Work Day** when nearly 150,000 commuters are expected to pedal to work or school as part of the National Bike Month.

Bicycling is an easy, efficient and healthy way to get to work, run errands and much more. "Bike to Work Day is the best day to try bicycle commuting for the first time!" says Norm Richardson, Chair of STA and Mayor of the City of Rio Vista.

The Bike Commuter of the Year Awards recognize Bay Area residents who are committed to using their bicycles to get to work. Every year, one winner is chosen from each of the nine Bay Area counties.
