2. COMPREHENSIVE TRANSPORTATION PLAN (CTP) OVERVIEW AND EWG PURPOSE

A. Objectives and Purpose

Robert Guerrero, STA, summarized the Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) and the upcoming Plan Update effort. He also discussed the role of the Equity Working Group (EWG) in the CTP Update. The EWG can anticipate guiding the development of the Equity Chapter in the CTP.

3. BACKGROUND AND CONTEXT

A. History of the EWG

Kathrina Gregana, STA, presented the history and background of the EWG and gave an overview of the committee's past accomplishments.

B. Federal, State, Regional, Local Context

Kathrina Gregana, STA, gave an overview of the Equity Designations that are used by federal, state, and regional transportation agencies to identify communities in need and to help target programs and funding to those areas.

Committee Member/Public Comments

Gary Raycraft, Habitat for Humanity Representative, requested information on an income breakdown for the Unincorporated County, which was not covered during the presentation.

Councilmember Jeannette Wylie asked for more information regarding the middle-class income divide as it relates to housing.

Councilmember Edwin Okumura asked why Rio Vista was not identified as an MTC Equity Priority Community (EPC), noting that the city had a high population of older adults, along with low-income and people with disabilities. Ms. Gregana responded that the MTC sets its definition and thresholds for identifying a census tract as an EPC and continued by saying that she would get back to Councilmember to see where the City of Rio Vista did not meet these thresholds.

Helen Marie Gordon, Vallejo Community Advocate, commented on the lack of representation of South Vallejo in the equity designation maps. Councilmember K. Patrice Williams echoed Ms. Gordon's concerns and added that she wanted to ensure the community was not left out of equity discussions.

Dwayne Hankerson, MTC Policy Advisory Council-Solano Representative, inquired about the equity definition the group was using and requested that equity include people with disabilities.

Kathrina Gregana, STA, presented on the accomplishments of the EWG in 2022, which include the development of the Equity Criteria as part of the One Bay Area Grant (OBAG) Cycle 3 process, nominating committee project priorities for the OBAG 3 process and serving as the Steering Committee for the Vallejo SolSTEP Project.

4. PRESENTATIONS

A. Vallejo Solano Sustainable Transportation Equity Project (SolSTEP) Project

Edwin Cortez, Club Stride, gave a presentation the Vallejo SolSTEP Project and gave an update on the progress of their work with Vallejo youth interns to develop a youth-led Community-Based Transportation Plan (CBTP)

Committee Member/Public Comments

Chair Vasquez asked how Club Stride continues to recruit and retain youth to participate in their program. Dr. Rhonda Renfro from Club Stride emphasized the importance of relationship-building with the youth and the community in advancing Club Stride's work.

Councilmember K. Patrice Williams asked if the internship through SolSTEP provides compensation to participating youth. Ron Grassi from STA responded that youth participants are compensated with the grant funding provided by the California Air Resources Board (CARB) grant that funded the SolSTEP project.

Solano Mobility Programs

Lorene Garrett and Debbie McQuilkin, STA, provided an overview of the Solano Mobility programs and services. Ms. Garrett presented on the Solano Mobility Employer Commuter Incentive Programs and Ms. McQuilkin presented on Solano Mobility Programs for Older Adults, People with Disabilities, Low-Income Individuals and Veterans. Ms. McQuilkin also shared that the STA will be working with the cities of Dixon and Rio Vista over the next fiscal year to develop their Community-Based Transportation Plans (CBTP).

Committee Member/Public Comments

Councilmember Edwin Okumura inquired about the outreach plan for the upcoming Rio Vista CBTP. Ms. McQuilkin, responded that the draft outreach plan in development for Rio Vista will incorporate a combination of public outreach mediums, such as workshops, mailers, tabling events, and city council meetings.

Councilmember Jeanette Wylie asked if a caretaker accompanying a veteran would be eligible to use Solano Mobility services for veterans, which was a question brought up to her by a constituent. Ms. McQuilkin responded that Solano Mobility currently has one contracted provider who would be able to serve caretakers who have military identification. She continued that while veteran programs are currently only available for veterans, STA staff are working to expand the program based on feedback that has been received through their outreach, such as expanding these services to surviving spouses who are in need of transportation options.

Dr. Rhonda Renfro from Club Stride asked if the Solano Mobility Bucks for Bikes Program is available to high school students. Ms. Garrett responded that the program is only available to Solano residents who are 18+ since this was the approval that staff received from the STA Board. Dr. Renfro suggested the expansion of the Bucks for Bikes Program to high school students given the need she sees among the youth to get to and from schools.
