On a motion by Supervisor Mashburn, and a second by Mayor Bird, the TREC unanimously approved the TREC meeting minutes of September 13, 2023.

5. INFORMATIONAL – DISCUSSION ITEMS

A. Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) Schedule and Meeting Objectives

Robert Guerrero, STA summarized the schedule and meeting objectives of the CTP and Transit and Rideshare Element

Committee Member/Public Comments:

None.

B. Member Agency Presentations on Rail and Ferry Plans and Competitive Projects Supporting Land Use

i. Solano Rail Hub – Suisun/Fairfield PDA Plans

Presented by: Kathrina Gregana, STA; Jim Bermudez, City of Suisun City, and Jonathan Atkinson, City of Fairfield.

Committee Member/Public Comments:

Vice Mayor Terry Scott inquired if the sites in the Downtown and Waterfront Priority Development Areas (PDAs) were incorporated into Suisun City's Housing Element and asked if affordable housing was being considered for the PDA sites. In response, Jim Bermudez clarified that a comparable amount of housing sites in the Downtown and Waterfront PDAs were captured in the latest Housing Element Update, with the opportunity to include additional sites in the next Housing Element update. He further explained that both affordable and market-rate housing was being incorporated into the Suisun City Downtown and Waterfront PDAs. Mayor Alma Hernandez added that the Suisun City Housing Authority will be exploring affordable housing for sites under their purview for future development.

ii. Hannigan Station – Fairfield-Vacaville Station PDA Specific Plan Presented by Jonathan Atkinson, City of Fairfield.

Committee Member/Public Comments:

Supervisor Mitch Mashburn inquired if the Train Station Specific Plan incorporated the development of Markeley Lane. In response, Dave Feinstein, City of Fairfield Planning Division Manager, clarified that the Train Station Specific Plan only included infrastructure plans for the development of new arterials, and did not capture local roads such as Markeley Lane. He continued by saying that construction of Markeley Lane will be taken on by the housing developer.

In response to Mr. Feinstein's clarification on Markeley Lane, Mr. Mashburn highlighted the importance of advancing the development of Markeley Lane to address traffic safety concerns such as long wait times and heavy traffic congestion during pick-up and drop-off times for students attending the three schools south of the Hannigan Train Station. Mr. Mashburn also brought up a concern he's heard from a Solano resident about the lack of an American with Disabilities Act (ADA) bathroom facility at the Hannigan Train Station.

iii. Vacaville Transit Center

Presented by Peyman Behvand, City of Vacaville.

Committee Member/Public Comments:

Supervisor Mitch Mashburn inquired if the City of Vacaville was considering concentrating future development in the northern section of Vacaville. In response, Peyman Behvand noted that those project sites are in alignment with the Downtown Specific Plan, which has a focus on bringing residential and mixed-use to support high-density development in the Downtown and Allison Priority Development Areas (PDAs).

C. Transit Element Draft Goals and Objectives Presented by Ryan Harris, STV

Summary of Committee Member/Public Comments:

Mobility

Diane Feinstein, Consortium Representative, under Section D, requested clarification on STA's role regarding supporting transit operators in functional consolidation. In response, Robert Guerrero, STA, noted that with the upcoming regional focus on functional consolidation, STA will closely monitor and continue facilitating conversations with member agencies and transit operators to keep them apprised and to advance the efficiency of our transit system while being reliable and consistent.

Regarding Section G, Ms. Feinstein asked about the baseline numbers being considered for passengers per vehicle revenue hour and how it would be measured. In response, Mr. Guerrero highlighted the state climate goals in reducing vehicle miles traveled (VMT) as a strategy to reduce carbon emissions. Member agencies have already begun making progress in addressing VMT in their respective projects, and STA will continue to work with member agencies on this front.

State of Good Repair

Regarding Section C, Ms. Feinstein asked for additional examples of transit facilities that needed improvement. Mr. Guerrero, highlighted the Bus Slip Ramp Project by the City of Fairfield.

Under Section C, Ms. Feinstein requested clarification language to define "Transit Facilities" and that it includes Ferry and Rail, emphasizing the importance of clarifying to the public that Rail and Ferry fall under Transit.

Under Section D, Ms. Feinstein asked for clarification on how safety would be improved in areas that do not have a prior history of accidents. In response, Mr. Guerrero, expressed the importance of being proactive to improve the safety and access to transit facilities especially as cities plan for growth.

Supervisor Mitch Mashburn concurred, noting future city plans to concentrate residential development around transit facilities. Mayor Alma Hernandez echoed Mr. Mashburn's comments on the importance of maximizing safety around transit facilities. Mayor Hernandez also noted her desire to see more multi-jurisdictional projects that will provide multiple benefits to the communities. Brian McLean, TAC Representative, also concurred and noted that safety was a top priority for the City of Vacaville.

Pippin Dew, WETA Representative, asked if safety could tie into the County's Vision Zero Program, to advance collaboration among member agencies on funding opportunities. In response, Josh Pilachowski, DKS, clarified that the safety goals in the CTP were consistent with the County's Vision Zero goals.

Sustainability and Resiliency

Under Section C, Ms. Feinstein requested to change the word "electrified" to "zero-emission" to cover the various ways to achieve zero-emission. In concurrence, Ms. Dew shared WETA's efforts to explore various technologies that include the use of hydrogen and electric fleets to achieve zero-emission goals.

Service Delivery

Beth Kranda, SolTrans, under Section G requested to add the word "cost-effective."

New Goal – Equity Framework

No comments.

Additional Comments:

Councilmember Walt Stanish inquired if safety measures were being considered in Mobility Hubs, to which Mr. Guerrero, responded by noting the importance of safety in the development of Mobility Hubs, and concluded by stating that STA will continue to coordinate with transit operators to address any safety concerns.

Chair McConnell further emphasized the importance of public safety and acknowledged the growing difficulty in addressing these challenges. STA staff noted these concerns.

7. ROUND TABLE DISCUSSION

- Pippin Dew, Vallejo has the most Priority Development Ares (PDAs) and is interested in understanding how the city could leverage funding and partner with member agencies to advance projects.
- Diane Feinstein reemphasized the importance of clarifying to the general public that rail and ferry are captured under transit.

MOBILITY

Provide Rider Convenience and Choice

- A. Provide access to county and regionally significant population centers, employment and civic amenities
- B. Connect these land uses and adapt to changes in demographics and employment patterns with a focus on Priority Development Areas (PDA)
- C. Support an equitable, efficient, and reliable local and intercity mass transit system that conveniently connects to regional transit systems
- D. Develop and implement programs to coordinate the provision of interregional, intercity and local transit services. When requested, support transit operators who are interested in system and functional consolidation, service expansion and innovation
- E. Ensure **accessibility** mobility by providing services for ALL through the programs of *Solano Mobility*
- F. Address "first mile/last mile" gaps by facilitating multimodal improvements such as mobility hubs
- G. Increase transit and rideshare usage at a faster rate than population growth to reduce regional VMT by tracking transit mode-share and passengers per vehicle-revenue hour
- H. Ensure system effectiveness by preparing periodic and timely reviews of transit service performance
- Implement effective paratransit services for ALL (i.e Solano County Intercity Taxi (ITX) Card program)



Create a Sustainable and Resilient Transit Network Help Improve Air Quality

- A. Reduce air pollutant emissions related to transit and rideshare by developing and implementing the Solano County Alternative Fuel and Infrastructure Plan.
- B. Assist transit operators who wish to upgrade fixed facilities to be more energy efficient.
- C. Achieve a fully electrified zero-emission transit and mobility system that enhances air quality, and promotes equitable access to efficient and affordable mobility solutions



Fund Vehicles, Facilities and Services

- A. To facilitate informed service and investment decisions, provide decision-makers with timely, accurate and sufficient information.
 - i. Ensure all major Transit Corridor Studies are conducted and kept up-to-date including for I-80/I-680/I-780, SR 12, SR 29 and SR 37
 - ii. Conduct Countywide Ridership Surveys every two to three years with specific target surveys of services to improve efficiency and productivity
 - iii. Assist transit operators to obtain and provide more accurate data and reporting
- B. Help fund adequate maintenance, repair and replacement of transit vehicles and supporting infrastructure **for regional service**
- C. Help fund adequate maintenance and strategic expansion of Transit Facilities of Regional Significance
- D. Facilitate informed service and investment decisions and provide decision-makers with timely, accurate and sufficient information
- E. Make investment decisions in partnership with regional and inter-regional transit providers, including local partners such as local transit providers, the Capitol Corridor Joint Powers Authority (CCJPA) and Water Emergency Transportation Authority (WETA) and regional partners such as BART, Metropolitan Transportation Commission, and Caltrans
- F. Participate in regional and mega-regional multimodal corridor studies and implementation on SR-37, I-80, and I-680.
- G. Facilitate a dynamic, responsive, resilient, and accessible and cost-effective microtransit system that seamlessly integrates into the countywide transportation network

What is the Comprehensive Transportation Plan?

The Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) is the primary long-range planning document for Solano County designed to create a safe, equitable, and sustainable multi-modal transportation system that meets the diverse mobility needs and sustainability goals of our communities. The plan will serve as a roadmap for the Solano Transportation Authority to guide transportation investments over the next 30 years, including active transportation (walking and biking), roadways and highways, public transit, equity, and land use.



The CTP is a foundational document that informs transportation projects and programs considered for the Metropolitan Transportation Commission's (MTC) Regional Transportation Plan, also known as **Plan Bay Area**. STA is updating project priorities and programs for submission to MTC's update of Plan Bay Area. The previous CTP was last updated in 2020.







What is the timeline for the CTP update?

Winter - Spring 2025
Identify existing conditions
and define project goals

Spring - Fall 2025Develop recommendations and draft plan

Fall 2025 - Winter 2026 Create final plan
